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SR20, Metcalf to Township Lane Widening & Bicycle/Pedestrian Improvements Project

NOTICE OF UPCOMING CONSTRUCTION WORK

September 15, 2011

This news release regards road closures and detours for the above project.

Construction work on the SR20, Metcalf to Township Lane Widening & Bicycle/Pedestrian Improvements Project in Sedro-Woolley continues. During the period September 19 through 23, curbs and sidewalk ramp installation will continue on the south side of SR20/Moore Street from Metcalf to Ball Streets. During this same time Public Utility District No. 1 crews will be making water main tie-ins at several locations on the route.

Traffic will be two-way with flagging control and occasional stops to allow construction traffic to enter the work zone. Side streets intersecting SR20 in the work zone will be limited to right in and right out motions. We apologize for the inconvenience and will work diligently to complete the work as quickly as possible to minimize impacts to residents and businesses.

There is also a full detour of SR20 traffic between Patrick Street and Puget Street planned starting at 7 am on Monday, September 26th. The detour will route traffic through downtown Sedro-Woolley via the SR20/Ferry Street intersection to Ferry Street and Puget Street, returning to SR20 at the Puget intersection. This closure is expected to last up to three weeks as Interwest Construction Inc. re-grades and repaves SR20 in the BNSF trestle area, and connects sidewalks adjacent to SR20 from Patrick Street to Metcalf Street. All local businesses will remain open during the planned detour and directional signs will be implemented to direct customers to the local businesses along SR20. SR20 between Ferry and Patrick Street will remain open to local traffic, and the Patrick Street roundabout will remain open and provides a return route to the SR20/Ferry intersection. The Contractor will notify individual residents and businesses at least 48 hours in advance of temporary driveway closures during the course of the work.
