



The City of Sedro-Woolley is currently in the process of reviewing the zoning within the entire City to address concerns about the compatibility of adjacent zoning designations. Of specific concern is the impact of industrial and commercial properties on single-family residential zones.

The City Planning Commission is holding a series of public meetings and hearings to gather input on the proposed zoning changes. You are invited to come and express your concerns, ask questions and comment on the proposed rezoning.

- **August 4, 2009, 7PM @ Council Chambers** – Joint Planning Commission / City Council worksession. The workshop is a casual gathering where the public can ask questions of and speak with Council members and Commissioners in a non-formal setting.
- **August 18, 6:30PM @ Council Chambers** – Regularly scheduled Planning Commission meeting. This session will include a brief summary of the process thus far followed by a chance for on-the-record public comments.
- **August 20, 6:30PM @ Council Chambers** – Open House w/Planning Commission. No formal presentation is planned, but maps and other information will be provided and staff and Planning Commissioners will be available to answer questions and hear concerns.
- **September 8, 2:00 – 4:00PM @ Council Chambers** – Second Open House for those unable to attend the earlier Open House.
- **September 8, 6:30PM @ Council Chambers** – Special Planning Commission meeting. This meeting will include a brief summary of the process thus far followed by a chance for on-the-record public comments. NOTE: this meeting replaces the regularly scheduled PC meeting for September because the PC will be having a training session on the day of the regularly scheduled meeting.
- **October 20, 6:30 PM @ Council Chambers** – Regularly scheduled Planning Commission meeting with Public Hearing on Rezone
- **Further Planning Commission and City Council meetings** – Additional meetings and hearings may be necessary depending on the progress of the project. The City Council will ultimately have to approve any changes proposed to the zoning map, comprehensive land use map and zoning regulations. The date of that meeting has not yet been determined.
