The worksession was called to order by Mayor Wagoner at 7:00 P.M.

Flag Salute

Roll Call: Present: Mayor Wagoner, Councilmembers: Judith Dunn Lee, Germaine Kornegay (Late), Brenda Kinzer, Chuck Owen and Rick Lemley. Staff: City Supervisor/Attorney Berg.

**Council Roundtable Discussion**

- Mayor Wagoner opened the meeting with a discussion about traffic issues at Nelson Street near SWHS. Councilmember Kinzer indicated that 3-6:00 pm are the key hours for bad traffic behavior. A discussion followed about the addition of a speed bump and additional enforcement to curb the poor behavior. Mayor Wagoner indicated that public works planned to install a speed bump.

Councilmember Kornegay arrived at 7:03 P.M.

- Mayor Wagoner reported that the Washington Senate capital budget proposal did not include the Sedro-Woolley Library request.
- City Supervisor/Attorney Berg introduced two possible projects for the upcoming Skagit County economic development grant program.

Councilmember Lemley moved to authorize the mayor and staff to apply for two \$500,000 grants, one to support the SR 20 corridor project (sidewalks, turn lane and channelization) between Township and Fruitdale and the other to build fiber between Burlington and Sedro-Woolley. Councilmember Dunn Lee seconded. Motion carried (5-0).

- Mayor Wagoner reminded councilmembers of the requirement from the PDC to file their annual F-1 reports.
- Councilmember Kornegay asked about street lighting at John Liner and Sapp. City Supervisor/Attorney Berg mentioned that he understood that request to be fairly expensive. Public Works Director Freiburger will follow up with Kornegay regarding the costs of the project. Councilmember Kornegay also discussed the formation of a business improvement area (BIA).

- Councilmember Lemley asked about pothole repair and wondered if the rainy weather was impeding the work. He also asked about Talcott improvements, specifically in the 800 block.
- Councilmember Owen asked about the intersection of Ball and Northern, there is a dip at the transition between Ball and Northern.
- Mayor Wagoner mentioned that the city is planning to install C-curbing on W State near the intersection with SR 9 to address the blocked intersection from people turning left from W. State into Floyd's and backing traffic onto SR 9.

Councilmember Dunn Lee moved to adjourn. Seconded by Councilmember Lemley. Motion carried (5-0).
